

DIY Beeswax Wrap





Materials needed:

- assorted fabric
- beeswax pellets
- brush
- pinking shears



Cut material in desired shape (circles, squares, or rectangles work best). Pinking shears will prevent the edges from fraying.

Tip: 100% cotton (washed) works best for absorbing the beeswax. This Christmas handbell fabric was purchased on spoonflower.com.



Sprinkle the beeswax pellets over the fabric. No need to completely cover the fabric; you can always add more if needed.

Tip: Beeswax pellets are available online or at major craft stores. The pellets are easier to work with but you can shave a block of beeswax for similar results.

Place the pellet-covered fabric on a baking sheet in a preheated oven at 200 degrees for about 5 minutes.

Tip: Line the baking sheet with parchment or wax paper as the beeswax is hard to clean if any melts onto the baking sheet.

Immediately spread the melted pellets around with a brush. Try to get an even coat over the entire fabric, especially the edges.





Hang to dry for about 2 hours.

Tip: Many DIY home crafting websites/blogs are available for more ideas for your beeswax wrap.

Another tip: Start small to get the feel for how your beeswax melts.
